<p><b>Araucaria araucana</b> 4 -5L £20 (7 year old)</p>	<p>Iconic medium to large tree up to Ht.20m. (<b>Monkey Puzzle</b>). Initially slow growing, an upright tree producing regular tiers of branches with rigid spine tipped, glossy green leaves. An endangered native of the Chilean and Argentinian Andes. Hardy and wind firm, grows best in moist, well drained soil.</p>
<p><b>Abelia 'Edward Goucher'</b> (not available at present)</p>	<p>A compact, bushy, semi-evergreen shrub of 1.5 x 1.5m. The bright glossy - green foliage is bronze-tinted when young. Lilac-pink flowers are freely borne in summer and autumn. Grow in a sheltered, sunny position in any moist but well-drained soil.</p>
<p><b>Actaea simplex 'Brunette'</b> 2L £7.50</p>	<p>A rhizomatous herbaceous perennial to 1.5m x 0.75m with upright purple - black stems and foliage. Dense racemes of fragrant white flowers during the autumn. Grow in a moist, humus-rich soil in sun or partial shade.</p>
<p><b>Actaea simplex 'Pink Spike'</b> 2L £7.50</p>	<p>A rhizomatous herbaceous perennial to 1.4m x 0.5m with upright purple - black stems and foliage. Dense racemes of fragrant pink flowers during the autumn. Grow in a moist, humus-rich soil in sun or partial shade</p>
<p><b>Agapanthus 'Dokter Brouwer'</b> 2L £7.50</p>	<p>A clump-forming herbaceous perennial with strap-like dark blue- green leaves. Stems of 0.8 – 1m carry clusters 20 cm across of blue flowers from early summer onwards. Grow in full sun in a well drained soil.</p>
<p><b>Alchemilla erythropoda</b> 1L - £5.00</p>	<p>A clump-forming perennial, native of the Balkans, up to 15cm high. Blue-green rounded leaves 4cm across with sharply toothed lobes. Sprays of small yellow - green flowers in July and August. Plant in a moist, well-drained soil in sun or partial shade.</p>
<p><b>Alstroemeria lutea</b> 2L £7.50</p>	<p>A hardy perennial from northern Chile. Flower stems up to 80cm carry loose clusters of yellow flowers spotted or streaked with red in summer. Flowers are good for cutting. Needs a well-drained soil in sun or light shade.</p>
<p><b>Amomyrtus luma</b> 2L £12.50</p>	<p>A large, dense evergreen shrub, native of Chile. Dark green leaves with reddish stalks are conspicuously copper-coloured when young. Fragrant white flowers in May followed by berries that start red and ripen to black. Plant in a sheltered position in a moist, well-drained soil in partial shade. Hardy to-10C.</p>
<p><b>Aristolelia chilensis</b> 3L £10.00</p>	<p>An interesting evergreen shrub from the Valdivian rainforest of Chile and adjacent Argentina, up to 3m x 3m. Lustrous green leaves up to 13cm long with reddish petioles on reddened stems. Small black fruits in autumn. Best in mild areas or well sheltered sites, in full sun or light shade in moist, well-drained soil.</p>
<p><b>Aronia x prunifolia 'Brilliant'</b> 2L £7.50</p>	<p>A deciduous shrub to 2m x 1.5m. Large clusters of small white flowers in spring followed by clusters of long-lasting bright-red berries. The glossy-green foliage turns brilliant red in the autumn. Grow in a reasonably fertile, moist yet well-drained soil in sun or partial shade.</p>
<p><b>Aronia x prunifolia 'Viking'</b> 2L £7.50</p>	<p>A vigorous deciduous shrub to 2m x 1.5m. Large clusters of small white flowers in spring followed by clusters of black edible fruits which last in to winter. The glossy - green foliage gives brilliant autumn colours. Grow in any reasonably fertile soil, in sun or partial shade.</p>
<p><b>Asplenium scolopendrium</b> 2L £7.50</p>	<p>A clump forming evergreen fern with broad, undulating strap-like fronds of rich green up to 70cm long. Plant in a moist, well-drained soil in a shady position.</p>

<b>Asplenium scolopendrium 'Angustifolia'</b> 2L £7.50	A clump forming evergreen fern with narrow, strap-like fronds with serrated edges of rich green up to 30cm long. Plant in a moist, well-drained soil in a shady position.
<b>Asplenium scolopendrium Crispum Cristatum Group</b> 2L £7.50	A clump forming evergreen fern with broad, strap-like fronds of rich green up to 60cm long with crested fan-like ends. Plant in a moist, well-drained soil in a shady position.
<b>Astelia nervosa 'Red Devil'</b> 2L £7.50	A hardy clump-forming perennial with upright sword-like metallic-red leaves to 60cm. Plant in a moist, well-drained soil in sun or partial shade. A good container plant for the patio.
<b>Astrantia 'Buckland'</b> 2L £5	A clump-forming perennial bearing soft dusky-pink flowers on 75cm stems above deeply cut, mid-green leaves. The longest flowering of all Astrantias. Grow in sun or partial shade in a moist, well-drained soil. Dead head before seeding to prevent self-seeding.
<b>Athyrium felix-femina 'Frizelliae'</b> 2L £7.50	An unusual, small fern of 30 x30cm. Very narrow fronds with rounded ball-like pinnae attached to the mid-rib reminiscent of a string of beads. Grow in a moist, well-drained soil in full or partial shade.
<b>Athyrium felix-femina 'Lady in Lace'</b> 2L £7.50	A slow growing, compact deciduous fern of 30cm x 30cm with ruffled parsley-like fronds. Plant in a moist, well drained soil in a shady position
<b>Athyrium niponicum var. pictum 'Red Beauty'</b> 2L £7.50	A deciduous clump forming fern of 40cm x 40cm. Arching triangular fronds of silvery-green with contrasting burgundy-red stalks and veins. Plant in a moist, well drained soil in a shady position.
<b>Athyrium niponicum var. pictum 'Silver Falls'</b> 2L £7.50	A deciduous clump forming fern of 30cm x 30cm. Arching triangular fronds of silver tinged with maroon. Plant in a moist, well drained soil in a shady position.
<b>Athyrium niponicum var. pictum 'Ursula's Red'</b> 2L £7.50	A deciduous, clump-forming fern of 30cm x 30 cm. The newly- emerging fronds are a rich purple-bronze with a silver sheen forming a striking contrast. Grow in a moist, fertile soil in full or partial shade.
<b>Aucuba japonica 'Rozannie'</b> 2L £7.50	A compact evergreen shrub of 1m x 1m. The broadly lanceolate, dark green leaves are conspicuously toothed towards the end. Purple-red flowers in April-May are followed by large red berries. Grow in any reasonable soil in sun or partial shade.
<b>Austrocedrus chilensis</b> <i>(not available at present)</i>	A slow growing, small columnar tree Ht. 12 - 15m. A beautiful species with foliage carried on frondose sprays. Native of Chile and Argentina found throughout the transition zone between the temperate rain forests and the Patagonian steppe.
<b>Azara dentata</b> 2L £12.50	A medium-sized evergreen shrub of 3m x 3m, native of Chile, for mild or sheltered gardens. The rigid leaves are matt-green above and grey-felted beneath. The fragrant yellow flowers are borne in late spring and early summer. Plant in a moist, well-drained soil in sun or partial shade in a warm, sheltered position or against a wall. Hardy to -5 - -7 C. A good conservatory plant.
<b>Azara integrifolia</b> 2L £12.50	A medium sized evergreen shrub of 3m x 3m, native of Chile and Argentina. Clusters of fragrant chrome-yellow flowers in late winter and early spring followed by white berries. Plant in a sheltered position in a moist, well-drained soil in sun or partial shade. Can be trained on a wall in colder areas. Hardy to -10C

<p><b>Azara integrifolia 'Variegata'</b> (not available at present)</p>	<p>A medium sized evergreen shrub of 3m x 3m with small, rounded dark green leaves edged pale- pink and cream, raised at Kew in about 1870. Clusters of fragrant chrome-yellow flowers in late winter and early spring followed by white berries. Plant in a sheltered position in a moist, well-drained soil in sun or partial shade. Can be trained on a wall in colder areas. Hardy to -10C</p>
<p><b>Azara lanceolata</b> 2L £7.50</p>	<p>A medium - sized or large shrub of 4m x 3m, native to Chile and Argentina, with narrow, bright green foliage. Small vanilla-scented, mustard-yellow flowers borne in profusion in April and May. Grow in a moist, well-drained soil in sun or partial shade. Shelter from cold winter winds or grow as a well-shrub.</p>
<p><b>Azara microphylla</b> 2L £10.00</p>	<p>The hardiest species of Azara. Native of Chile and the borderlands of Argentina. An elegant, evergreen small tree or large shrub upto Ht. 6m. Clothen with sprays of very dark green small leaves. Clusters of deep yellow, vanilla scented flowers appear in spring. Requires a sheltered site in full sun or partial shade. Plant in any moist, well drained soil. Makes a good wall shrub.</p>
<p><b>Azara microphylla 'Albovariegata'</b> 2L £12.50</p>	<p>A variegated form of the hardiest species of Azara. An elegant evergreen shrub to 5m. The sprays of small dark green leaves are broadly edged white. Clusters of deep-yellow vanilla-scented flowers in spring. Plant in a sheltered position in a moist, well-drained soil in sun or partial shade. Makes a good wall-trained shrub.</p>
<p><b>Azara microphylla 'Gilt Edge'</b> 2L £12.50</p>	<p>A variegated form of the hardiest species of Azara. An elegant evergreen shrub to 5m. The sprays of small dark green leaves are broadly edged creamy-white with a pink tinge. Clusters of deep-yellow vanilla-scented flowers in spring. Plant in a sheltered position in a moist, well-drained soil in sun or partial shade. Makes a good wall-trained shrub</p>
<p><b>Azara microphylla 'Variegata'</b> 2L £12.50</p>	<p>A variegated form of the hardiest species of Azara. An elegant evergreen shrub to 5m. The sprays of small dark green leaves are edged creamy-white. Clusters of deep-yellow vanilla-scented flowers in spring. Plant in a sheltered position in a moist, well-drained soil in sun or partial shade. Makes a good wall-trained shrub.</p>
<p><b>Azara patagonica</b> 3L £10.00</p>	<p>A rare species of Azara found in Chile. An evergreen shrub Ht. 2.5m x S 2.5m with glossy, tooth edged leaves, clusters of fragrant yellow flowers appear in late spring and summer. Needs a sheltered site in full sun or light shade. Any well drained moist soil. A good wall shrub or conservatory plant.</p>
<p><b>Azara petiolaris</b> 3L £12.50</p>	<p>An evergreen shrub to 2.5m from central Chile. (Hardy -7 to -10°C). Extremely fragrant small yellow flowers in spring. Leathery dark-green leaves with sharply pointed teeth with reddish petioles. Needs a sheltered site in sun or light shade and moist, well drained soil. Good as a wall shrub.</p>
<p><b>Azara serrata</b> 3L £12.50</p>	<p>Endemic to Chile. An evergreen shrub with shiny oval serrate leaves Ht. 2.5m x 2.5m. Dense spherical clusters of very fragrant yellow flowers appear over summer and autumn. Requires a sheltered site in full sun or light shade. Any well drained moist soil. A good wall shrub.</p>
<p><b>Azara uruguayensis</b> 2L £10.00</p>	<p>A medium-sized to large shrub of 4m x 3m, native to Uruguay and Brazil. Leaves are oblong, up to 10cm long and bronze-tinted when young. Small yellow flowers in drooping spikes in early spring. Needs a warm, sheltered site or protection from a wall and moist, well- drained soil. Sun or partial shade</p>

<p><b>Begonia coccinea</b></p>	<p>A glasshouse perennial with upright cane-like stems of 1.2m bearing pendulous panicles of pink or coral-red flowers. Introduced by William Lobb from Brazil in 1841. Now very rare in cultivation. Grow in a free-draining, slightly acidic compost in good light but avoiding direct sun, with a minimum winter temperature of 10°C</p>
<p><b>Berberidopsis corallina</b> <b>(Chilean coral plant)</b></p> <p>2L £12.50</p>	<p>A choice, evergreen, twining climber up to 5m endemic to the Coastal Cordillera of southern Chile. Leathery heart-shaped leaves with toothed margins, dark green above, glaucous beneath. Deep- crimson flowers borne in late summer in pendant racemes. Best on a sheltered, shaded wall in moist, free-draining lime-free soil. A good cool conservatory plant. Endangered in the wild.</p>
<p><b>Berberis chilensis</b></p> <p>1L £7.50 <i>(not available at present)</i></p>	<p>An evergreen shrub from central Chile. Elliptic to ovate lanceolate leaves 5cm long x 2.5cm wide with up to 5 spine- tipped teeth. Thorns up to 5cm singularly or in 3's. Racemes of lemon-yellow flowers are followed by spherical matt-blue fruits. Plant in a sheltered, sunny position in a moist, well drained soil. Protect from cold, drying winds. Hardy to -5 to -8C</p>
<p><b>Berberis darwinii</b></p> <p>2L £10.00</p>	<p>A medium-sized evergreen shrub of 2m x 2m, native of Chile and Patagonia with dark glossy-green, toothed leaves. Drooping clusters of bright orange, tinted red flowers in spring and early summer are followed by clusters of blue berries. Grow in any reasonable soil in sun or partial shade. Discovered by Charles Darwin and introduced by William Lobb.</p>
<p><b>Berberis darwinii 'Compacta'</b></p>	<p>Evergreen shrub of 1m x 1m of compact, dense, bushy habit. 3-pointed dark shiny green leaves, drooping clusters of bright orange, red-tipped flowers through spring followed by blue-black berries. Plant in any reasonable soil in sun or partial shade.</p>
<p><b>Berberis empetrifolia</b></p> <p>1L £7.50</p>	<p>A dwarf semi-evergreen shrub of 0.4 x 1m, native of Chile and Argentina. Slender, arching stems bearing narrow leaves with rolled edges. Small golden yellow flowers in May followed by blue-black berries. Well suited to the rock or scree garden. Needs a well drained lime-free soil in sun or light shade.</p>
<p><b>Berberis microphylla</b></p>	<p>A medium-sized evergreen shrub endemic to the Patagonian regions of Argentina and Chile. Small dark-green spiny-tipped leaves. Flowers deep orange-yellow in April and May are followed by purple- blue berries. Moist, free-draining soil in full sun.</p>
<p><b>Berberis microphylla 'Pygmaea'</b></p> <p>2L £7.50</p>	<p>A slow growing, dense evergreen shrub to 60cm, with dark green rounded leaves, grey beneath Thorns are much reduced. Yellow flowers in spring followed by purple berries in autumn. Grow in any moist, well drained soil in sun or semi-shade.</p>
<p><b>Berberis sieboldii</b></p> <p>2L £7.50</p>	<p>A compact, suckering, deciduous shrub native to Japan (1.3 x 1.3m). The oval, mid-green leaves borne on reddish stems turn radiant orange and red in the autumn. Pale yellow flowers in April-May are followed by shiny orange-red fruits. Moist but well drained soil in full sun. Superb for autumn colour.</p>
<p><b>Bergenia 'Beethoven'</b></p> <p>2L £5.00</p>	<p>A neat, clump-forming evergreen perennial of 30cm x 45 cm. Tight rosettes of shiny, deep-green leaves are topped by large dense clusters of white flowers with dark red calyces borne on tall red stems during April-June. Grow in any reasonable soil in sun or partial shade.</p>

<p><b>Besconneria yuccoides</b> <b>'Quicksilver'</b></p> <p>2L £7.50</p>	<p>An evergreen yucca-like perennial . the sword-shaped leaves are grey-green with a silvery sheen. Tall, arching pink-red flower stems up to 2m carry drooping racemes of green flowers shading to red at the base on established plants . Plant in full sun in a free draining soil. Remarkably hardy given adequate drainage, or grow as a container plant and over-winter under cover.</p>
<p><b>Bomarea edulis (syn. B. hirtella)</b></p> <p>2L £7.50</p>	<p>A tuberous, deciduous, twining perennial climber to 2m from Central and South America. Clusters of bell-shaped flowers, pale red or pink outside, green and yellow with dark red markings on the inside borne from early summer into autumn. Grow under glass in bright light but not full sun in a well-drained compost, or outside in a container and overwinter under cover.</p>
<p><b>Bomarea salsilla</b></p> <p>2L £7.50</p>	<p>A tuberous, deciduous twining perennial climber to 2m from Chile. Clusters of dark pink or purple tubular flowers with blue and dark purple markings in early summer. Grow in a moist, well-drained soil over a support or through a shrub. A mulch applied once the stems have died down will help protect the crown and tubers. Alternatively in a conservatory or container and overwinter under cover.</p>
<p><b>Brunnera macrophylla</b> <b>'Hadspen Cream'</b></p> <p>2L £5.00</p>	<p>A clump-forming herbaceous perennial with large heart-shaped green leaves broadly margined with creamy-yellow. Sprays of small, clear-blue flowers borne in spring. Plant in a humus-rich, moist but well drained soil in partial shade</p>
<p><b>Brunnera macrophylla</b> <b>'Jack Frost'</b></p> <p>2L £5.00</p>	<p>A perennial that produces large heart-shaped silver leaves with green veins and edges in spring topped by sprays of small, blue forget-me-not-like flowers. Plant in a moist, well drained soil in partial shade.</p>
<p><b>Buddleja 'ARGUS ® Velvet'</b></p> <p>3L £7.50</p>	<p>A medium sized deciduous shrub. Slender pendulous panicles of purple flowers are produced throughout summer. Grow in full sun or semi-shade in a moist, well drained soil. Best hard pruned in March. Dead-heading will prolong flowering. Semi-sterile so produces hardly any seed.</p>
<p><b>Buddleja 'Pink Delight'</b></p> <p>4L £7.50</p>	<p>A medium sized deciduous shrub. Long panicles of bright pink scented flowers are produced throughout summer. Grow in full sun or semi-shade in a moist, well drained soil. Best hard pruned in March. Dead-heading will prolong flowering.</p>
<p><b>Buddleja davidii 'Black Knight'</b></p> <p>4L £7.50</p>	<p>A medium sized deciduous shrub. Long panicles of very deep violet flowers are produced throughout summer. Grow in full sun or semi- shade in a moist, well drained soil. Best hard pruned in March. Dead-heading will prolong flowering.</p>
<p><b>Buddleja davidii 'Royal Red'</b></p> <p>4L £7.50</p>	<p>A medium sized deciduous shrub. Large panicles of purple-red flowers are produced throughout summer. Grow in full sun or semi- shade in a moist, well-drained soil. Best hard pruned in March. Dead - heading will prolong flowering.</p>
<p><b>Buddleja davidii 'White Profusion'</b></p> <p>4L £7.50</p>	<p>A medium sized deciduous shrub. Large panicles of pure white flowers with a yellow eye are produced throughout summer. Grow in full sun or partial shade in a moist, well-drained soil. Best hard pruned in March. Dead - heading will prolong flowering.</p>
<p><b>Buddleja globosa</b></p> <p>5L £12.50</p>	<p>An erect, large (4m x 4m) semi-evergreen shrub from the Andes of Chile, Peru and Argentina. Lance-shaped dark-green leaves are carried on quadrangular stems. Orange-yellow ball-like, honey-scented inflorescences 2.5 cm across are borne in profusion in early summer. Grow in a moist but well drained soil in sun or semi-shade.</p>

<b>Buglossoides purpureocaerulea</b> 1.5L £5.00	A rhizomatous evergreen perennial up to 30cm high, which sends out long trails of dark green lanceolate leaves forming a good, low ground cover. Bright gentian-blue flowers are borne in late spring and summer. Grows best in full sun in a free-draining soil.

<b>Caesalpinia spinosa</b> 3L £15.00	A strong-growing shrub from northern Chile and Peru. Evergreen, with bi-pinnate mid-green leaves and spines on the stems. Elegant pea-like yellow-orange flowers with red flecking in 20cm long panicles in summer. A plant for a warm, sheltered site, best against a sunny wall in a well drained soil.
<b>Calandrinia umbellata</b> P9 £2.50 1L £3.00	A compact and bushy perennial, 5-20cm tall. Leaves linear-lanceolate. Flowering stems erect with a compact terminal umbel with numerous, satiny rich violet to deep rosy-magenta flowers to 2cm across in July-August. Individual flowers last for two days and only open in the afternoon in the sun. Native of Chile and Andean Argentina. Grow in full sun in sharply drained soil or raised bed.
<b>Calceolaria arachnoidea</b> 1L £3.00	A clump-forming perennial growing to 0.25m with grey, felty leaves. The dark purple flowers are borne from August to October. Native of the Chilean Andes to 3000m, grow in full sun or light shade in a moist but well drained soil. Hardy but dislikes wet soils in winter. A good rock garden plant or for a container.
<b>Callitris rhomboidea</b> 5L £20.00	A rare pine for mild gardens, sheltered site or conservatories. Native to Australia. A small columnar tree with delightful bright green or glaucous green foliage, branches divided into a mass of small, slender sprays up to Ht. 12m x S. 4m. Grow in a well drained soil. These plants are grown from seed of Tasmanian provenance without protection in Herefordshire.
<b>Carex morrowii 'Fisher's Form'</b> 1L £5.00	A compact, clump forming evergreen perennial of 0.4 x 0.4m with upright, slightly arching, narrow leaves of deep green edged with creamy-white. Plant in a moist, well-drained soil in sun or partial shade. Works well as a container plant.
<b>Ceanothus 'Autumnal Blue'</b> 2L £7.50	An evergreen shrub to 2.5 x 2.5m. Panicles of rich sky-blue flowers borne in summer and autumn, but often in spring as well. Raised by Burkwood and Skipwith, it is possibly the hardiest evergreen hybrid ceanothus. Plant in a sunny position with shelter from cold winds in any reasonable free-draining soil.
<b>Ceanothus 'Burkwoodii'</b> 2L £7.50	A dense, compact, rounded evergreen shrub of 2m x 2m. with glossy-green oval leaves. Rich dark blue flowers carried in abundance through summer and autumn. Raised by Burkwood and Skipwith. Plant in a sunny position with shelter from cold winds in any reasonable free-draining soil.
<b>Ceanothus papillosus</b> 2L £7.50	An upright evergreen shrub to 3m from California with comparatively long, narrow leaves with a warty surface and are sticky to the touch. Rich blue flowers in profusion during late spring-early summer. Discovered by David Douglas and introduced by William Lobb. Plant in a sunny position with shelter from cold winds in any reasonable free-draining soil. One of the less hardy species.
<b>Ceanothus thyrsiflorus 'Snow Flurry'</b> 2L £7.50	A medium-sized evergreen shrub to 5m with glossy green foliage. Pure white flowers in carried in profusion in early summer. An excellent wall shrub, it can also be trained as a small tree in milder areas. Plant in a sunny position with shelter from cold winds in any reasonable free-draining soil.
<b>Ceanothus 'Victoria'</b> 2L £5.00	A dense, hardy, evergreen shrub of 1.5m x 1.5m with upright branches bearing dark green leaves. Clusters of deep blue flowers borne profusely during late spring and summer. Requires full sun, a well drained soil and some shelter from cold winds
<b>Ceratostigma griffithii</b> 1.5L £7.50	A beautiful, small, deciduous or semi-evergreen shrub of 1m x 1.5m from the Himalaya and W China that produces deep blue flowers through the autumn. The leaves turn deep red in the late autumn contrasting wonderfully with the flowers, and persist until into the new year. Grow in a warm, sunny position in well drained soil.

<b>Ceratostigma willmottianum</b> 3L £10.00 1L -£7.50	A small, deciduous sub-shrub from China and Tibet of 1m x 1m. The lanceolate leaves up to 5cm long, turn bright red in the autumn. Rich-blue flowers 2.5cm across are borne in dense terminal clusters from July until autumn. Grow in full sun or partial shade in any moist, well-drained soil.
<b>Chaenomeles speciosa 'Nivalis'</b> 2L £7.50	A spreading deciduous shrub with spiny branches bearing glossy, ovate dark green leaves. Pure white saucer-shaped flowers 4cm across borne in spring are followed by large yellow fruits. Plant in a moist, well-drained soil in sun or partial shade. A good wall shrub.
<b>Chamaecyparis lawsoniana 'Pottenii'</b> 3L £10	A dense, slow-growing medium-sized columnar conifer of 3m x 1m with sea-green foliage in soft, feathery sprays. Plant in a moist, well drained soil in sun or partial shade.

<b>Chamaecyparis pisifera 'Sungold'</b> 3L - £10	A dwarf, slow growing conifer of 2m x 2m with attractive thread-like golden yellow foliage. Plant in a moist, well drained soil in sun or partial shade. Withstands full sun.
<b>Cistus x loretii</b> 2L £7.50	
<b>Clerodendrum bungei</b> 4L - £10.00	A semi-woody suckering deciduous shrub from China. The erect stems rising to 2m carry large purple-green heart-shaped leaves and terminate in large corymbs of fragrant rosy-red flowers in August and September. Plant in any reasonable soil in sun or partial shade.
<b>Clethra alnifolia (Sweet pepper bush)</b> 3-4L £12.50	A deciduous, suckering shrub from E. North America that will in time form an extensive colony up to 2 m in height. Finely-toothed obovate leaves and erect terminal racemes of white, sweetly-scented flowers in July-August. Good for bees and butterflies. Grow in a moist but well drained, acidic soil in partial shade.
<b>Colletia hystrix (syn. C. armata)</b> 2L £7.50	A robust shrub of 2.5 x 2.5m, native of Chile and N. Argentina. An almost leafless shrub, the stems bear strong, stout spines. The branches are crowded with small, fragrant, white flowers during late summer and autumn. Plant in a well-drained soil in full sun and sheltered from cold winds.
<b>Colletia hystrix 'Rosea' (syn. C. armata 'Rosea')</b> 2L £7.50	A robust shrub of 2.5 x 2.5m. An almost leafless shrub, the stems bear strong, stout spines. The branches are crowded with small, fragrant, white flowers opening from pink buds during late summer and autumn. Plant in a well-drained soil in full sun and sheltered from cold winds.
<b>Colletia spinosissima</b> 2L £7.50	A spiny, almost leafless shrub to 2m x 2m, native to Chile, Argentina and Ecuador. Fragrant white flowers are produced in late spring and summer. Best in a sheltered sunny position in moist but well drained soil.
<b>Convallaria majilis</b> 2L £3.50	A rhizomatous perennial of 10cm x 50cm, with bright green leaves. Pendulous, white, highly fragrant bell-shaped flowers in spring are followed by red berries. Grow in a humus-rich, moist soil in full or partial shade.
<b>Convallaria majilis 'Albostriata'</b> 2L £3.50	A rhizomatous perennial of 10cm x 50cm, with green leaves striped along their length with creamy-white. Pendulous, white, highly fragrant bell-shaped flowers in spring are followed by red berries. Grow in a humus-rich, moist soil in full or partial shade.
<b>Cornus mas</b> 2L £7.50	A deciduous, large shrub or small, densely branched tree up to 4m x 4m. Small clusters of tiny yellow flowers in profusion during late winter followed by bright red cherry-like fruits. Leaves turn purple before falling in the autumn. Plant in a moist, well drained soil in sun or partial shade.

<p><b>Cornus 'Norman Haddon'</b></p> <p>4-5L £15.00</p>	<p>A small tree with arching branches (a hybrid between <i>C.capitata</i> and <i>C.kousa</i>), elliptical leaves turning reddish in autumn. Flower heads 8cm in width, with four ovate white bracts turning pink with age. Fruit strawberry-like. Up to height / spread 8m / 10 years. It is hardy to -15°C (5°F) but, shelter from cold winds. It likes a humus rich soil.</p>
<p><b>Cornus officinalis</b></p> <p>2L £7.50</p>	<p>A deciduous, large shrub or small tree of 4m x 3m with peeling warm- brown bark. Native of Japan and Korea. Clusters of small yellow flowers are borne on the bare shoots in February which are followed by red fruits. The leaves turn shades of red and orange before falling. Grown in any moist, well-drained soil in sun or partial shade</p>
<p><b>Cornus sanguinea 'Midwinter Fire'</b></p> <p>2L £7.50</p>	<p>A small deciduous shrub that provides wonderful autumnal and winter interest. With autumn's approach, the leaf colour turns from a dark-green to orange-yellow. During winter, bright yellow-orange and red stem colour give cheer. Ht. 1.5 m x S. 0.8m. To retain the juvenile vibrant form, a bi-annual prune of the stems back to 10cm above ground is required in spring. Moist fertile soil, full sun to light shade.</p>
<p><b>Cornus sanguinea 'Winter Beauty'</b></p> <p>2L £7.50</p>	<p>A compact deciduous shrub that provides wonderful autumnal colour with the leaves turning from a mid-green to orange-yellow. During winter, bright yellow-orange and red stem colour give cheer. Ht. 3 m x S. 2.5m. To retain the juvenile vibrant form, a bi-annual prune of the stems back to 10cm above ground is required in spring. Moist fertile soil, full sun to light shade.</p>
<p><b>Cotoneaster conspicuus 'Decorus'</b></p> <p>2L £7.50</p>	<p>A medium-sized evergreen shrub of 1m x 2m with arching branches and small, glossy, dark-green leaves. Abundant small white flowers are followed by long-lasting red fruits. Excellent as ground cover and a good plant for bees and birds. Grow in any reasonable soil.</p>
<p><b>Cotoneaster procumbens 'Queen of Carpets'</b></p> <p>2L £7.50</p>	<p>A very prostrate, creeping evergreen shrub, 15cm high and spreading to 1.5m, densely clad with glossy, dark green leaves. Small white flowers borne profusely during summer are followed by crimson berries. A good plant for bees and birds. A robust plant, grow in any reasonable soil.</p>
<p><b>Cotoneaster 'Rothschildianus'</b></p> <p>2L £7.50</p>	<p>A large, semi-evergreen shrub of 5m x 5m, spreading in habit when young. Large clusters of small white flowers followed by creamy-yellow fruits. Plant in any reasonable soil in sun or partial shade. Shelter from cold winds in colder regions.</p>
<p><b>Cotoneaster x suecicus 'Coral Beauty'</b></p> <p>3L £7.50</p>	<p>A very dense, small shrub with arching branches 1m x 2m. Small, glossy, dark green leaves, and small white flowers in spring and summer. Bright orange-red fruits borne in profusion in the autumn. Grow in a well drained soil or dry situations in sun or semi-shade. Excellent for ground cover.</p>
<p><b>Crinodendron hookerianum</b></p> <p>2-3L £7.50 4-5L £12.50</p>	<p>A large, dense evergreen shrub Ht. 5m x S. 3m. Native to the Valdivian rain forests of Chile. In May - June it becomes a wonderful spectacle, with it's long stalked, fleshy crimson flowers hanging like lanterns in abundance.Requires a lime free soil moist and free draining. It appreciates light shade.</p>
<p><b>Crinodendron hookerianum 'Ada Hoffmann'</b></p> <p>2-3L £7.50</p>	<p>A medium sized evrgreen shrub with narrow, lanceolate leaves Ht. 3m x S. 3m. In May - June it becomes a wonderful spectacle, with it's long stalked, fleshy pale - pink flowers hanging like lanterns in abundance. A direct clone of the red Chilean Lantern tree selected in the wild within the Valdivian rain forests of Chile. Requires a lime free soil moist and free draining. It appreciates light shade.</p>
<p><b>Crinodendron patagua</b></p> <p>2L £7.50 4L £12.50</p>	<p>A medium sized evergreen shrub / small tree Ht. 3m x S. 3m. Dark green, glossy ovate leaves. Fragrant, fringed, bell shaped flowers bourne in late summer. Hardy to -5 degrees C, best grown as a wall shrub. It requires a lime free soil, moist and well drained soil. Native of the Andes in central and southern Chile.</p>

<p><b>Crocoshmia x crocosmiiflora</b> <b>'Citronella'</b></p> <p>2L £5.00</p>	<p>A clump-forming cormous perennial (0.75 x 0.45m) with strap-like leaves. Arching stems bearing racemes of funnel-shaped pale to medium-yellow flowers in summer and autumn. Plant in any moist, well-drained soil in sun or partial shade. Divide large clumps in spring.</p>
<p><b>Crocoshmia x crocosmiiflora</b> <b>'Honey Angels'</b></p> <p>2L £5.00</p>	<p>A clump-forming cormous perennial (0.5 x 0.4m) with strap-like leaves. Arching stems of trumpet-shaped yellow flowers in summer and autumn. Plant in any reasonable soil in sun or partial shade. Divide congested clumps in spring.</p>
<p><b>Cupressus dupreziana var. atlantica (syn. C. atlantica)</b></p> <p>2L £15.00</p>	<p>A narrowly conical, hardy conifer, native of Morocco where it is now critically endangered, with some trees 2500 years old. Grow in any reasonable, well-drained soil in sun or partial shade with some shelter from cold, drying winter winds.</p>
<p><b>Cytisus purpureus 'Lilac Lady'</b></p> <p>2L £5.00</p>	<p>An elegant small shrub of 0.5 x 0.5m with gently arching branches which often root where they touch the ground. Trifoliate dark-green leaves. Soft-lilac coloured flowers in May. Plant in a sheltered, sunny position in a free draining soil.</p>

<p><b>Decaisnea fargesii</b></p> <p>2L £12.50</p>	<p>Decaisnea fargesii is an upright, multi-stemmed, deciduous shrub that is native to woodlands, thickets, mountain slopes and ravines in western China, Bhutan, NE India, Myanmar, Nepal and Sikkim. This shrub typically grows to 20' tall and as wide. It is ornamentally grown in some areas for its long odd-pinnate leaves, its monoecious flowers in drooping racemes and its exceptional metallic blue bean-like fruit pods.</p>
<p><b>Desfontainea spinosa</b></p> <p>2L £12.50</p>	<p>An evergreen shrub with small, holly-like leaves, slowly reaching 1.8m, from South America. First introduced from Chile by plant collector William Lobb. The pendent tubular flowers borne in the summer and autumn are scarlet with a yellow-orange mouth. Grow in a sheltered position in semi-shade in a lime-free, moist but well drained soil.</p>
<p><b>Deutzia crenata 'Pride of Rochester'</b></p> <p>2L £5.00</p>	<p>An upright, deciduous shrub to 2.5m with arching branches and peeling brown bark when mature. Panicles of double white flowers flushed with pink. Plant in any moist but well-drained soil. Flowers best in full sun but will tolerate light shade.</p>
<p><b>Deutzia gracilis 'Marmorata'</b></p> <p>2L £5.00</p>	<p>A small deciduous, upright, bushy shrub of 1.2 x 1.2m. Fragrant white star-shaped flowers in spring and summer amongst mottled green and cream foliage. Plant in a moist, well drained soil in sun or partial shade.</p>
<p><b>Deutzia hookeriana</b></p> <p>3L £7.50</p>	<p>A rare deciduous, small shrub from Sikkim and W. China of upright arching habit (1.5 x 1.5m). Corymbs of fragrant white flowers with a pink flush in May-July. Sun or semi-shade in any moist, well drained soil.</p>
<p><b>Deutzia x hybrida 'Perle Rose'</b></p> <p>2L £5.00</p>	<p>An upright, deciduous shrub to 1.2 x 1.2m. Long ovate-lanceolate leaves. Flowers of soft-rose in long-stalked panicles in early summer. Plant in any moist but well-drained soil. Flowers best in full sun but will tolerate light shade.</p>
<p><b>Dipelta yunnanensis</b></p> <p>2L £12.50</p>	<p>A rare, large, upright, deciduous shrub of 3m x 3m from W. China, introduced by George Forrest. Ovate-lanceolate leaves 12 cm long of mid-green. The Weigela-like flowers borne in April and May are cream tinged with pink with orange throats. Plant in a moist, well drained soil in sun or partial shade.</p>
<p><b>Discaria serratifolia (Vent.) B. &amp; H. ex Masters</b></p> <p>2L £12.50</p>	<p>A medium-sized deciduous shrub of 3m, native of Central and Southern Chile and Argentina. Lustrous green leaves on drooping branches with paired 2cm long thorns. Fragrant, white flowers in crowded fascicles borne on the previous year's wood in early summer. Plant in well drained soil in a sunny, sheltered position with shelter from cold, drying winds.</p>

<b>Disporum sessile 'Variegata'</b> 2L £5.00	A spreading, rhizomatous perennial with green and white striped leaves on stems up to 40cm high. Creamy-white, drooping, bell-shaped flowers are borne in spring and early summer. Grow in full or partial shade in a humus-rich, moist, lime-free soil. A good plant for shaded or woodland gardens.
<b>Drimys winteri</b> 2L £12.50	A small slender, conical tree Ht.7-8m. A native to the Magellanic and Valdivian temperate rain forests of Chile and Argentina, where it is seen as a dominant species of the evergreen coastal forests. Evergreen leathery, aromatic leaves and clustered fragrant star-shaped white flowers with yellow creamy centres are borne April - May. Sun or light shade, any moist well drained soil. Hardiness to - 10 degrees C
<b>Dryopteris sieboldii</b> 2L £5.00	A striking semi-evergreen fern from Japan with arching, dark green, leathery, pinnate fronds up to 0.5m in length. It slowly spreads by means of short, creeping rhizomes. Prefers a moist but well drained lime-free soil in light shade.

<b>Elymus magellanicus</b> 2L £5.00	A tufted deciduous grass, native to the mountains of southern Chile and Argentina. Slow growing, it forms dense clumps of vivid-blue to 40cm x 50cm. Plant in a moist, well-drained soil in full sun for best leaf colour. Good for rock gardens and raised beds.
<b>Embothrium coccineum (Chilean fire tree)</b> 3L £15.00	An erect semi-evergreen tall shrub or small tree introduced from Chile by first introduced by William Lobb. Brilliant orange-scarlet flowers in May - June. Needs a moist but well drained, lime-free soil, in a warm, sheltered position in sun or semi-shade with protection from cold winds.
<b>Empetrum rubrum</b> <i>(not available at present)</i>	A dwarf, evergreen heath-like shrub forming dense mats to 0.3 x 0.5m, from Chile, Argentina and the Falkland Islands. Purple flowers in spring and summer are followed by red fruits on female plants. Grow in sun or semi-shade in a lime-free, moist but well drained soil.
<b>Epimedium davidii</b> 2L £7.50	Rare, a clump forming semi-evergreen perennial from W. China. Leaves coppery when young, aging to green, turning rusty - red in autumn. Small flowers of bright yellow appear on stems up to Ht. 30cm long from mid-spring to early summer. Moist, well drained soil in partial shade. Good woodland plant.
<b>Epimedium grandiflorum 'Lilafee'</b> 2L £7.50	A compact deciduous, clump forming perennial (Ht. 40cm x S. 50 cm). Bronze tinted leaves age to mid green. Sprays of 2.5cm wide purple flowers on wiry stems in April - May. Moist, well drained lime free soil in partial shade.
<b>Epimedium leptorrhizum</b> 2L £7.50	Low growing, evergreen rhizomatous perennial of Central and Southern China. New leaves reddish-bronze age to olive green and are topped by short spikes of large lavender pink flowers in April - May. Moist well drained soil, in light shade.
<b>Epimedium sempervirens 'Creamsickle'</b> 2L £7.50	Rare, a clump forming evergreen perennial with leaves splashed with a creamy white variegation. Pure white, pendulous flowers on upright stems to 30 cm appear in spring. Moist, lime free soils, light shade.
<b>Epimedium x rubrum</b> 2L £7.50	A deciduous rhizomatous perennial to 30cm x 30 cm. Young leaves, tinted red becoming pale green before turning red brown in autumn. Crimson and pale yellow flowers on wiry stems in April & May. Moist, well drained soil in partial shade.
<b>Epimedium x versicolor 'Neosulphureum'</b> 2L £7.50	A semi-evergreen rhizomatous perennial with bronze coloured new foliage in spring. Soft yellow and cream flowers on 40cm stems in spring, later than 'Sulphureum'. Any reasonable soil, in partial shade.
<b>Epimedium x versicolor 'Sulphureum'</b> 2L £7.50	A deciduous rhizomatous perennial to Ht.40cm x S. 50cm. Red tinted light green leaves, turning red in autumn. Open sprays of primrose yellow flowers in April. Fertile, humus rich soil in sun or light shade.

<p><b>Epimedium x warleyense</b> 2L £7.50</p>	<p>A compact evergreen rhizomatous perennial of 30cm x 30cm raised in the garden of Ellen Willmott. Young leaves are tinted red. The flowers consist of bright coppery-orange sepals and smaller pale yellow petals in early spring. Plant in a moist, well-drained soil in partial shade.</p>
<p><b>Escallonia angustifolia var. coquimbensis</b> 2L £7.50</p>	<p>A rarely offered evergreen shrub from the Andes of Coquimbo Region of Chile at altitudes up to 3000m. Short, dense panicles of white flowers in summer. Grow in a moist, well-drained soil on sun or light shade with shelter from cold winter winds. Hardy to -8°C</p>
<p><b>Escallonia illinita</b> 2L £7.50</p>	<p>A tall evergreen shrub up to 3m high native to Chile with aromatic glandular shots bearing large glossy-green leaves. Panicles of fragrant white flowers during summer and autumn. Well drained soil in sun or light shade. Drought tolerant, but shelter from cold winds.</p>
<p><b>Escallonia 'Iveyi'</b> 2L £7.50</p>	<p>A strong-growing evergreen shrub of 3m x3m with glossy dark green leaves and large panicles of white flowers in summer and autumn. Originated as a seedling at Caerhays Castle, Cornwall and named for a gardener there. Grow in a fertile, well-drained soil in a sunny position sheltered from cold winds.</p>
<p><b>Escallonia pulverulenta</b> 2L £7.50</p>	<p>A fast growing evergreen shrub up to 2.5 m high from central Chile. Needs a mild, sheltered site (hardy -7 to -10°C) in full sun and shelter from cold winds. Can be grown as a wall shrub. Leathery glossy green toothed leaves and panicles of white flowers in late summer and autumn.</p>
<p><b>Escallonia resinosa</b> 2L £7.50</p>	<p>An evergreen shrub or small tree of 5m x 3m, although can be readily trimmed to size/shape from Chile and Peru. Reddish-pink pubescent shoots and shiny-green, sticky, toothed leaves. Notable for its curry-like aroma, particularly in humid conditions or following rain. White flowers in spring and early summer. Grow in moist, well-drained soil in a sunny position.</p>
<p><b>Escallonia revoluta</b> 2L £7.50</p>	<p>An evergreen shrub of 2-3m in cultivation, native to Chile. The shoots and toothed leaves are covered in a grey tomentum. Terminal racemes of soft-pink to white flowers are borne from August to October. Grow in a sheltered position or with wall protection in a moist but well-drained soil.</p>
<p><b>Escallonia rubra var. macrantha</b> 2L £7.50</p>	<p>A strong-growing evergreen shrub to 4m from Chile with glossy dark green, aromatic leaves. Panicles of rose-crimson flowers in summer. Grow in a fertile, well-drained soil in a sunny position sheltered from cold winds. Excellent as a coastal hedging plant.</p>
<p><b>Escallonia virgata</b> 2L £7.50 4L £12.50</p>	<p>A deciduous shrub Ht 2m x S 2m with graceful, arching branches bearing small glossy, dark green leaves. Raceames of pure white flowers appear June - July. A native of southern Chile and Argentina growing upto the tree line and found as far south as the Magellan Straits, it is the hardiest of the Escallonias. Not for chalky soil.</p>
<p><b>Eschscholzia lobbii</b> P9 X 4 £5.00</p>	<p>A small, annual 'Californian Poppy' which forms a rosette of finely divided glaucous leaves. Erect stems to 15cm high each bearing a single flower of yellow or yellow-orange. Grow in any well-drained soil in full sun.</p>
<p><b>Eucalyptus alpina</b> 2L £10.00</p>	<p>A rare, small tree or large shrub, endemic to the Grampians in Victoria, Australia. Shiny grey-green leaves. Grow in a moist but well-drained soil in a sunny position. Shelter from cold winds.</p>
<p><b>Eucryphia cordifolia</b> 2L £10.00</p>	<p>A large evergreen shrub, native of central Chile, with oblong, wavy-edged leaves. White flowers from June to September. Plant in a sheltered position in a moist, well drained soil in sun or partial shade. Protect from cold, drying winds</p>
<p><b>Eucryphia glutinosa</b> 3-4L £15.00</p>	<p>A large deciduous shrub with pinnate glossy green foliage. Ht. 8m x S.4m. A native to Chile it is found within wooded habitats. Large fragrant white flowers are bourne from July to September. Requires a sheltered position, hardy to -10 degrees C. ideally canopy in sun and light shade below. Grow in lime free soil.</p>

<p><b>Eucryphia x nymansensis</b> <b>'Nymansay'</b></p> <p>2L - £7.50</p>	<p>Columnar dense evergreen tree or small shrub Ht. 15m S.5m. Leaves dark green elliptic and toothed, Flowers large white 7cm across August - September. Moist free draining neutral to acid soil. Shelter from cold drying winds.</p>
<p><b>Euonymus europeaus</b> <b>'Red Cascade'</b></p> <p>2L £7.50</p>	<p>A large deciduous shrub or small tree to 3.5m x 2.5m. Small yellow-green flowers followed by abundant scarlet capsules which split open to reveal orange-coated seeds. Leaves turn a rich scarlet in autumn before falling. Plant in a moist, well drained soil in sun or partial shade.</p>
<p><b>Euonymus hamiltonianus</b> <b>'Indian Summer'</b></p> <p>2L £7.50</p>	<p>A large deciduous or occasionally semi-evergreen shrub to 3m x 3m. Small yellow-green flowers are followed by pink fruits which split open to reveal orange or red-coated seeds. The leaves turn vivid crimson and purple in autumn before falling. Plant in a moist, well drained soil in sun or partial shade.</p>

<p><b>Fabiana imbricata 'Prostrata'</b></p> <p>2L £7.50</p>	<p>A low-growing, mound-forming heath-like evergreen shrub of 0.6 x 1m. Plumes of pale mauve-tinted tubular flowers borne during the summer. Grow in a well-drained soil in a sunny position and with shelter from cold, drying winds. Hardier than the species and ideal for a larger rock garden or wall top.</p>
<p><b>Fabiana imbricata f. violacea</b></p> <p>2L £7.50</p>	<p>An upright medium-sized heath-like evergreen shrub of 1.5 x 1.5m, native of Chile and Argentina. Plumes of lavender-mauve tubular flowers borne during the summer. Grow in a well-drained soil in a sunny position and with shelter from cold, drying winds.</p>
<p><b>Fascicularia bicolor</b></p> <p>2L £7.50</p>	<p>An evergreen perennial forming rosettes of toothed, mid to dark green linear leaves, up to 50cm long. In summer, mature rosettes develop a dense central cluster of pale blue flowers surrounded by white bracts, at which time the inner-most leaves turn bright scarlet. Native of central Chile. Grow in full sun in a free-draining soil.</p>
<p><b>Fatsia japonica</b></p> <p>2L £7.50</p>	<p>A medium-large evergreen spreading shrub of 3m x 3m, native of Japan. The large, polished, palmate leaves are up to 45cm across. Panicles of white flower heads in October followed by black fruits. Plant in a moist, well drained soil in sun or partial shade.</p>
<p><b>Fitzroya cupressoides</b></p> <p>2L £7.50</p>	<p>A graceful cypress like conifer with descending branches. Ht. 15m x S6m. Slow growing and hardy but best sheltered from strong winds. Any moist well drained soil. Endangered in it's native temperate rain forests of Chile and Argentina.</p>
<p><b>Fothergilla major</b></p> <p>2L £7.50</p>	<p>A slow growing, somewhat suckering deciduous shrub of 2m x 2m from the Alleghany Mountains of USA. Small 'bottlebrush' spikes of white flowers borne in spring just before or with the new leaves which are oval, glossy-green. In autumn these turn brilliant orange and red. Moist but well-drained lime-free soil in sun or semi-shade.</p>
<p><b>Francoa appendiculata</b></p> <p>2L £5.00</p>	<p>Hardy, evergreen clump-forming perennial (0.3 x 0.3m) with deeply-lobed leaves and tall spikes (90cm) of pale-pink flowers, each petal with a dark-pink central stain, throughout summer and autumn. Moist, well-drained soil in sun or partial shade. Endemic to Chile.</p>
<p><b>Francoa sonchifolia</b></p> <p>2L £5.00</p>	<p>Hardy, evergreen clump-forming perennial (0.3 x 0.3m) with deeply-lobed leaves. Tall spikes (70cm) of shell-pink flowers, each petal with a red-pink centre, throughout summer and autumn. Moist, well- drained soil in sun or partial shade. Endemic to Chile.</p>
<p><b>Fuchsia denticulata</b></p> <p>2L - £5.00</p>	<p>A strongly upright-growing evergreen shrub of 2.5m x 1.5m from Peru and Bolivia for the conservatory or grown in a container outside and overwintered under glass although it will survive outside in mild gardens. Long, tubular reddish-pink flowers often tipped green.</p>

<b>Fuchsia magellanica var. gracilis</b> 2L £5.00	A graceful shrub with slender, arching stems. The small scarlet and violet flowers are freely borne through summer and autumn, the sepals being unusually long and slender. Grow in full sun or partial shade in a moist, well-drained soil.
<b>Fuchsia magellanica var. molinae</b> 2L £5.00	A hardy fuchsia with graceful arching branches and lance shaped soft green leaves. Ht. 1m x S 1m. Abundant pale pink flowers appear throughout late summer. Moist, fertile soil in full sun or light shade. Suitable for containers. Shelter from cold winds and apply a deep mulch pre-winter. First collected from the island of Chiloe, Chile.
<b>Fuchsia magellanica 'Pumila'</b> 2L £5.00	A dwarf cultivar that makes a robust, dense plant up to 60cm high. Small, narrow red and purple flowers borne throughout summer and autumn are prominent against the dark green foliage. A good plant for the front of a border or path edge. Plant in any moist, well-drained soil in sun or partial shade.
<b>Fuchsia magellanica 'Versicolor'</b> 2L £5.00	A small shrub of spreading habit with slender stems. The leaves are grey-green, rose-tinted when young and irregularly variegated with cream and pink when mature. The pendant flowers, borne through summer and autumn have a scarlet calyx and violet petals. Grow in full sun or partial shade in a moist, well-drained soil.
<b>Fuchsia paniculata</b> 2L £5.00	An evergreen shrub of up to 3m x 2m from the highlands of Central America, for the conservatory or grown in a container outside and overwintered under glass, although it will survive outside in mild gardens. Panicles of rosy-purple flowers from April under glass or summer outside.

<b>Gaultheria insana</b> 2L £5.00	An upright evergreen shrub up to 0.5m. White flowers borne April- June. The flowers are hermaphrodite so self-pollinates to produce ornamental brownish-red fruits. A native of S. Chile and Argentina, it requires a moist, lime-free soil and grows best in dappled shade. First introduced by Standish & Noble's nursery in the mid-1800's but has always been rare in cultivation.
<b>Gaultheria mucronata 'Alba'</b> 2L £5.00	The Prickly Heath from the Magellan Straits of Chile is hardy, dwarf evergreen shrub with wiry stems to 60-90cm. Small bell-shaped white flowers in May and June are followed by white fruits with a faint pink tinge which deepens with age. Best planted in groups or with a male form for pollination. Plant in a lime-free, moist but well drained soil in sun or partial shade.
<b>Gaultheria mucronata 'Cherry Ripe'</b> 2L £5.00	The Prickly Heath from the Magellan Straits of Chile is hardy, dwarf evergreen shrub with wiry stems to 60-90cm. Small bell-shaped white flowers in May and June are followed by large bright, cherry-red fruits. Best planted in groups or with a male form for pollination. Plant in a lime-free, moist but well drained soil in sun or partial shade.
<b>Gaultheria mucronata 'Mascula'</b> 2L £5.00	The Prickly Heath from the Magellan Straits of Chile is hardy, dwarf evergreen shrub with wiry stems to 60-90cm. Small bell-shaped white flowers in May and June. This is a non-fruiting male form but is prolific in flower. Plant in a lime-free, moist but well drained soil in sun or partial shade.
<b>Gaultheria mucronata 'Rosea'</b> 2L £5.00	The Prickly Heath from the Magellan Straits of Chile is hardy, dwarf evergreen shrub with wiry stems to 60-90cm. Small bell-shaped white flowers in May and June are followed by large light-pink fruits. Best planted in groups or with a male form for pollination. Plant in a lime-free, moist but well drained soil in sun or partial shade.
<b>Geranium 'Stephanie'</b> 2L £5.00	A compact mound-forming hybrid (30 x 45cm) discovered at the RBG Edinburgh. Clusters of lavender-blue flowers with darker veining in summer. Rounded but deeply lobed grey-green foliage. Any moist, well-drained soil in sun or partial shade.
<b>Geranium macrorrhizum 'White-Ness'</b> 2L £5.00	A semi-evergreen, rhizomatous perennial with divided, aromatic foliage which turns red in the autumn. A profusion of small, pure-white flowers are borne from early summer onwards. Introduced from Mount Olympus by Ness Botanic Gardens, Cheshire. A good plant for dry shade.

<b>Geranium nodosum</b> 2L £5.00	A deciduous perennial from southern Europe with glossy green three-lobed leaves. Clusters of dark-veined, light-pink flowers are produced from late spring until autumn. Low-growing and quick spreading. Adaptable to most soils in sun or shade.
<b>Geranium x oxonianum f.thurstonianum</b> 2L £5.00	A vigorous, low growing perennial with light-green 5-lobed leaves. Pink-purple flowers with very narrow petals are borne during the summer. Grow in a moist, well-drained soil in sun or shade.
<b>Gillenia trifoliata</b> 2L £5.00	A rhizomatous, deciduous perennial from NE USA and Canada. Reddish stems up to 1m high bear small three-lobed leaves. Sprays of delicate star-shaped white flowers with red calyces are borne in profusion in summer. In autumn the leaves turn to shades of copper and red. Grow in a moist, well-drained neutral or slightly acidic soil in partial shade.
<b>Gladiolus flannaganii</b> 1L £5.00	
<b>Gunnera magellanica</b> P9 £5.00	A dwarf, carpeting perennial from southern South America and the Falkland Islands. Cupped, kidney-shaped, scalloped, glossy dark-green leaves 5-9cm across on short erect stalks. Grow in partial shade in a humus-rich, permanently moist soil.

<b>Hebe topiaria</b> 2L £5.00	A small, compact, dome-shaped evergreen shrub (0.5 x 0.5m) from New Zealand with small grey-green leaves and short, dense racemes of white flowers in summer on established plants. Sun or partial shade in a moist but well drained soil.
<b>Hemerocallis 'Catherine Woodbery'</b> 2L £7.50	A clump forming semi-evergreen perennial with upright flower stems reaching 75cm high. Orchid-pink flowers with yellowy green centres 15cm across are produced from mid-summer. Grow in a moist, well - drained soil in full sun for best flowering although will tolerate some shade.
<b>Hemerocallis 'Golden Chimes'</b> 2L £7.50	A clump forming semi-evergreen perennial with upright flower stems reaching 90cm high. Broadly trumpet-shaped flowers 5cm across are bright yellow, tinged red on the reverse. Grow in a moist, well-drained soil in full sun for best flowering although will tolerate some shade.
<b>Hemerocallis 'Joan Senior'</b> 2L £7.50	A clump-forming semi-evergreen perennial with upright flower stems reaching 50-60cm. Flowers of pale lemon fading to creamy-white from mid-summer to early autumn. Grow in a moist, well drained soil in full sun for best flowering but will tolerate some shade.
<b>Hemerocallis 'Little Grapette'</b> 2L £7.50	A compact clump-forming semi-evergreen perennial with upright flower stems reaching 50-60cm. Flowers of grape-purple from early summer to early autumn. Grow in a moist, well drained soil in full sun for best flowering but will tolerate some shade.
<b>Hemerocallis 'Mrs Hugh Johnson'</b> 2L £7.50	A clump forming deciduous perennial with upright flower stems reaching 1.2m high. Large dark-red flowers with yellow or yellow-green throats are produced from early summer in to autumn. Grow in a moist, well-drained soil in full sun for best flowering although will tolerate some shade.
<b>Hemerocallis 'Roswitha'</b> 2L £7.50	A deciduous perennial with flower stems reaching 40cm high. Double flowers 8cm across, peach with a purple centre above a green throat, are produced in summer. Grow in a moist, well-drained soil in full sun for best flowering although will tolerate some shade.
<b>Hemerocallis 'Stella de Oro'</b> 2L £7.50	A compact deciduous perennial with flower stems reaching 30cm high. Fragrant, rounded yellow flowers are produced throughout summer. Grow in a moist, well-drained soil in full sun for best flowering although will tolerate some shade.

<p><b>Heptacodium miconioides</b></p> <p>3L £10.00</p>	<p>A hardy, vigorous, deciduous shrub of upright habit of 5m x 3m from China. Conspicuously 3-veined leaves are retained until early winter. Whorls of small, fragrant white flowers are borne in summer and autumn and the calyx colours bright-red after flowering . The stems and branches have light-brown peeling bark. Grow in a sheltered position in sun or partial shade in a moist, well-drained soil.</p>
<p><b>Hesperantha coccinea (syn Schizostylis)</b></p> <p>2L £5.00</p>	<p>A semi-evergreen perennial from South Africa with narrow strap-like mid-green leaves. Cup-shaped blooms of rich crimson in slender spikes of 60cm from September to early winter. Plant in a moist, well drained soil in full sun.</p>
<p><b>Hesperantha coccinea 'Fenland Daybreak' (syn Schizostylis)</b></p> <p>2L £5.00</p>	<p>A semi-evergreen perennial from South Africa with narrow strap-like mid-green leaves. Star-shaped blooms of coral-pink in slender spikes of 70cm from September to early winter. Plant in a moist, well drained soil in full sun.</p>
<p><b>Hesperantha coccinea 'Jennifer' (syn Schizostylis)</b></p> <p>2L £5.00</p>	<p>A semi-evergreen perennial from South Africa with narrow strap-like mid-green leaves. Large cup-shaped blooms of mid-pink in slender spikes of 60cm from September to early winter. Plant in a moist, well drained soil in full sun.</p>
<p><b>Hesperantha coccinea 'Major' (syn Schizostylis)</b></p> <p>2L £5.00</p>	<p>A semi-evergreen perennial from South Africa with narrow strap-like mid-green leaves. Large cup-shaped blooms of deep red in slender spikes of 60cm from September to early winter. Plant in a moist, well drained soil in full sun.</p>
<p><b>Hesperantha coccinea 'Mrs Hegarty' (syn Schizostylis)</b></p> <p>2L £5.00</p>	<p>A semi-evergreen perennial from South Africa with narrow strap-like mid-green leaves. Cup-shaped blooms of deep rose-pink in slender spikes of 60cm from September to early winter. Plant in a moist, well drained soil in full sun.</p>
<p><b>Hesperantha coccinea 'Pink Princess' (syn Schizostylis)</b></p> <p>2L £5.00</p>	<p>A semi-evergreen perennial from South Africa with narrow strap-like mid-green leaves. Cup-shaped blooms of light pink in slender spikes of 60cm from September to early winter. Plant in a moist, well drained soil in full sun.</p>
<p><b>Hesperantha coccinea 'Very pale pink' (syn Schizostylis)</b></p> <p>2L £5.00</p>	<p>A semi-evergreen perennial from South Africa with narrow strap-like mid-green leaves. Our own un-named selection with cup-shaped blooms of very pale pink in slender spikes of 60cm from September to early winter. Plant in a moist, well drained soil in full sun.</p>
<p><b>Hosta 'Big Daddy'</b></p> <p>2L £5.00</p>	<p>A clump forming perennial of 0.6 x 1m. Large, rounded, cupped, frosted-blue leaves. White to pale-lavender flowers borne on 1m stems in summer and autumn. Plant in a moist, well drained soil in partial shade.</p>
<p><b>Hosta 'Devon Green'</b></p> <p>2L £5.00</p>	<p>A clump forming perennial of 0.5 x 0.5m. Highly glossy dark green leaves. Pale-lilac flowers in summer and early autumn. Plant in a moist, well drained soil in partial shade.</p>
<p><b>Hosta 'Francis Williams'</b></p> <p>2L - £5.00</p>	<p>A clump-forming perennial of 1m x 1m. The large, broadly heart-shaped, puckered leaves have conspicuous veining . They are grey-green with wide, irregular yellow-green margins. Pale lilac flowers on 75cm stems in late summer. Plant in a moist, well drained soil in partial shade.</p>
<p><b>Hosta 'June'</b></p> <p>2-3L £5.00</p>	<p>A compact clump-forming perennial. The heart-shaped grey-green leaves develop a large golden yellow centre in the summer. Pale purple flowers in late summer. Plant in a moist but well drained soil in partial shade.</p>
<p><b>Hosta 'Lady Guinevere'</b></p> <p>2L - £5.00</p>	<p>A clump-forming perennial of 0.4 x 0.8m. Gold centred leaves with a ruffled green margin. Pale purple flowers in late summer. Plant in a moist, well drained soil in partial shade.</p>
<p><b>Hosta 'Night before Christmas'</b></p> <p>2L - £5.00</p>	<p>A clump-forming perennial. Large dark green leaves with a clear white centre, forming a clump 45cm x 90cm. Pale lavender- coloured flowers borne on 90cm stems in late summer. Plant in a moist but well drained soil in partial shade.</p>

<b>Hosta 'Patriot'</b> 2L £5.00	A clump-forming perennial of 0.5 x 1m. The puckered olive-green leaves have irregular cream margins. Lavender-blue flowers in July and August. Plant in a moist, well drained soil in partial shade.
<b>Hosta 'Whirlwind'</b> 2L £5.00	A clump forming perennial of 0.5m x 1m. Continually changing leaf colour. With a base colour of dark green, in spring the leaf centre is creamy-white with green veining, turning light green in mid-summer, then dark green in late summer. Lavender-coloured flowers in late summer. Plant in a moist, well drained soil in partial shade.
<b>Hydrangea arborescens 'Annabelle'</b> 2L £5.00	A small, bushy, deciduous shrub of 1.5 x 1.5m with slender-pointed, serrated leaves. Large rounded heads up to 30cm across of pure white ray-florets are borne in succession from July to October. Grow in full sun or partial shade in a moist but well-drained soil.
<b>Hydrangea paniculata 'Limelight'</b> 2L £5.00	A deciduous shrub of 2.5 x 2.5m. Dense clusters of long-lasting flowers on upright, sturdy stems during mid-summer and autumn emerge lime-green, fade to cream and eventually become pink-tinted. Grow in sun or partial shade in a moist, well-drained soil.
<b>Hydrangea paniculata 'Unique'</b> 2L £5.00	A deciduous shrub of 3m x 2.5m. Large, broadly conical panicles of large, white, sterile flowers which age to purplish-pink are borne from late summer. Grow in sun or partial shade in a moist, well- drained soil.
<b>Hypericum androsaemum 'Orange Flair'</b> 2L £5.00	A compact semi-evergreen shrub to 75 x 75cm. Yellow flowers are freely borne in summer and autumn followed by orange-red fruits. Plant in a moist, well drained soil in sun or partial shade. A good container plant.
<b>Hypericum henryi</b> 2L £7.50	A delightful upright shrub of 2m x 2m from S.E. Asia and China, with gracefully arching branches bearing small dark green leaves. From mid-summer golden yellow flowers 5cm across are produced at the branch tips followed by small red-tinted green fruits. Moist, well drained soil, full sun or light shade.
<b>Hypericum kouytchense</b> 2L £7.50	Small elegant semi evergreen compact shrub Ht.1m x S.1.5m from South China. Flowers golden yellow 6cm across with long stamens June to October followed by bright red capsules in autumn. Moist well drained soil in sun or light shade.



<b>Ilex aquifolium 'J C Van Tol'</b> 2L £5.00	An evergreen shrub or tree of 6m x 3m. Purple-tinted young shoots and glossy, almost spineless dark-green leaves. Self-fertile, producing regular crops of red berries. Plant in any reasonable soil. Best in sun but tolerates partial shade.
<b>Ilex aquifolium 'Myrtifolia'</b> 2L £5.00	A small, dense, evergreen holly to 2.0 x 1.5m with purple shoots and small dark-green leaves some of which have soft spines and some entire. Grow in any fertile soil in sun or partial shade. A male clone but does very occasionally carry berries.
<b>Iris forrestii</b> 2L £10.00	A clump-forming perennial from China and Burma, introduced by George Forrest. The grass-like leaves are glossy on one side and matt on the other. Scented primrose-yellow flowers with reddish-brown veining on 40cm stems in summer. Plant in a moist, well drained soil in sun or partial shade.
<b>Iris gracilipes</b> 1L £5.00 2L £7.50	A dwarf species to 20cm from China and Japan with arching pale green foliage. Lilac-blue flowers marked with white and yellow are borne from late spring and through the summer. Plant in a moist, well- drained soil in sun or partial shade.
<b>Iris 'Jane Phillips'</b> 2L £7.50	A Tall Bearded iris with flower stems up to 1m in height. Fragrant light- blue flowers with darker veins at the base and a white beard up to 20cm across in early summer. Grow in a fertile well-drained soil in full sun.
<b>Iris laevigata 'Variegata'</b> 2L - £5.00	A rhizomatous perennial with flower spikes to 70cm bearing purple- blue flowers with white markings in early summer. The narrow leaves are heavily striped creamy-white. Plant in a moist to wet, humus rich soil in sun or partial shade. Thrives at the edge of streams or ponds.

<p><b>Iris pallida 'Argentea Variegata'</b> 2L £5.00</p>	<p>A Tall Bearded iris with grey-green leaves edged with white. Fragrant light purple-blue flowers with purple veins on white at the base in early summer on stems to 60cm. Plant in a fertile, well-drained soil in full sun.</p>
<p><b>Iris sibirica 'Silver Edge'</b> 2L £5.00</p>	<p>A clump-forming perennial with flower stems up to 1m during mid to late spring. Flowers comprise rich-blue standards with white edging and deep blue falls edged white and with a yellowish-white base. Plant in any moist, well-drained soil in sun or partial shade.</p>
<p><b>Iris sibirica 'Tropic Night'</b> 2L £5.00</p>	<p>A clump-forming perennial with flower stems up to 1m during mid to late spring. Flowers are a rich violet-blue with white and yellow markings at the base. Plant in any moist, well-drained soil in sun or partial shade.</p>
<p><b>Iris sibirica 'White Swirl'</b> 2L £5.00</p>	<p>A clump-forming perennial with flower stems up to 1m during mid to late spring. Flowers are a pure white flushed yellow at the base. Plant in any moist, well-drained soil in sun or partial shade.</p>

<p><b>Jovellana punctata</b> 2-3L £7.50</p>	<p>An interesting woody perennial or sub-shrub from Chile. Grow in a sheltered, sunny position in a moist but free-draining soil. Has survived -8C with us, shooting from the base in spring. Protect the base of the plant with a mulch in early winter.</p>
<p><b>Jovellana violacea</b> 2L £7.50</p>	<p>A beautiful small evergreen sub-shrub, native to Chile for a warm spot in a fertile, well drained soil, container or conservatory. Small, toothed leaves are carried on upright shoots which in May to August are clothed in pale lilac flowers with purple-spotted yellow throats.</p>
<p><b>Juniperus recurva var. coxii</b> (not available at present)</p>	<p>An elegant tree with gracefully drooping branches of bright green foliage, found from Yunnan, China to North Myanmar. First introduced by Euan Cox and Reginald Farrer. A broadly columnar tree to 10m x 5m. Grow in any moist, well-drained soil.</p>

<p><b>Lapageria rosea</b> (Chilean Bellflower) 2L £15.00</p>	<p>The national flower of Chile. A beautiful evergreen climber with strong, wiry, twining stems and leathery leaves. Rose-crimson, waxy, bell-shaped flowers 7.5 x 5cm during summer and autumn (and through winter if grown in a conservatory). Needs a cool, moist, lime-free soil in full or partial shade. Grow on a sheltered wall in mild areas, otherwise an excellent conservatory plant. Avoid direct sunlight.</p>
<p><b>Lapageria rosea 'Pink Panther'</b> 2L £20.00</p>	<p>A beautiful evergreen climber with strong, wiry, twining stems and leathery leaves. Very light pink flowers, slimmer than in the species, during summer and autumn (and through winter if grown in a conservatory). Needs a cool, moist, lime-free soil in full or partial shade. Grow on a sheltered wall in mild areas, otherwise an excellent conservatory plant. Avoid direct sunlight.</p>
<p><b>Lardizabala funaria</b> (syn. <i>L. biternata</i>)</p>	<p>A vigorous twining evergreen climber introduced from Chile by plant collector William Lobb. The compound leaves are composed of 3-9 dark green, glossy leaflets. The chocolate-brown, almost black flowers appear in late autumn and winter followed by edible dark purple sausage-shaped fruits 7.5cm long. Grow on a sheltered wall in sun or semi-shade in (hardy to <math>-10^{\circ}\text{C}</math>), in a rich, moist but well drained soil, in a conservatory or an un-heated greenhouse.</p>
<p><b>Lathyrus belinensis</b> (not available at present)</p>	<p>An annual sweet pea discovered in Turkey in 1987. Critically endangered in the wild. The fragrant flowers consist of strongly veined orange-red standards with bright yellow wings. It will climb to 1 – 1.5m or can be planted in a container or hanging basket to trail. Best in a sunny position.</p>

<p><b>Lathyrus chilensis</b></p> <p>2L £5.00</p>	<p>A hardy perennial climbing pea to 2.5m from the forest edges of southern Chile. Pale pink flowers carried on long stems from spring until late summer. Moist well drained soil in a sunny position.</p>
<p><b>Lathyrus davidii</b></p> <p>2L £7.50</p>	<p>A very rare, hardy, perennial short climber to 1.3m from E. Asia. First collected by Père Armand David in 1863. Large pale-green leaves and cream coloured flowers that age to orange or toffee-brown after pollination borne in July and August. Best in semi-shade in a moist, well-drained soil.</p>
<p><b>Lathyrus subandinus</b> (not available at present)</p>	<p>A hardy, bushy, scandant perennial to 0.6m from the Andes of central Chile. Large lilac-blue and white flowers during spring and summer. Best in a sunny position in a rich, well-drained soil.</p>
<p><b>Latua pubiflora</b></p> <p>2L £15.00 4L £20.00</p>	<p>Rare, semi-evergreen shrub native to the Coastal Cordilleras of Chile and Chiloé island of 2.5 x 2.5m. Pendant magenta flowers borne in January- April followed by flattened spherical, pale-yellow fruits. Grow in a rich, moist, free-draining soil with some protection from cold winds. Hardy to -8°C. Can be grown as a wall shrub. An autumn-applied mulch may be beneficial. Toxic.</p>
<p><b>Libertia ixioides 'Goldfinger'</b></p> <p>1L £5.00</p>	<p>An evergreen clump forming perennial with grass-like leaves striped golden yellow. Small star-shaped pure-white flowers from mid-spring followed by yellow berries. Plant in a moist, well drained soil. Best in full sun. An excellent container plant.</p>
<p><b>Libertia peregrinans</b></p> <p>1L £5.00</p>	<p>A compact, rhizomatous, clump-forming evergreen perennial, native of New Zealand. Narrow orange-tinted leaves 50cm long. Small clusters of white flowers amongst the foliage in spring and summer are followed by yellow berries. Plant in a sunny position in a moist, well-drained soil.</p>
<p><b>Libertia peregrinans 'Gold Leaf'</b></p> <p>1L £5.00</p>	<p>A compact, rhizomatous, clump-forming evergreen perennial, native of New Zealand. Narrow orange-tinted leaves 50cm long with a prominent orange mid-rib. Small clusters of white flowers amongst the foliage in spring and summer are followed by yellow berries. Plant in a sunny position in a moist, well-drained soil.</p>
<p><b>Lithraea caustica</b></p>	<p>A very rarely grown plant from the coastal ranges and Andean foothills of central Chile. An evergreen shrub in cultivation. Requires a free-draining, well sheltered sunny position in a mild location. <b>CAUTION: THE POISONOUS SAP CAUSES DERMATITIS. HANDLE WITH EXTREME CARE !</b></p>
<p><b>Lobelia bridgesii</b></p> <p>2-3L £7.50</p>	<p>An upright perennial to 1m with winged stems and narrow, lanceolate, mid-green leaves and spikes of delicate pink flowers from mid-summer to late autumn. An endangered species endemic to Chile where it now only grows in an area of 10square Km. Grow in a sheltered position in a well-drained soil in sun or partial shade and some winter protection or in a container and over-winter indoors.</p>
<p><b>Lobelia excelsa</b></p> <p>2-3L £7.50</p>	<p>A tall, evergreen shrub to 2.5m from the coastal regions of central Chile with linear - lanceolate leaves to 25cm in length. Flowers begin yellowy-orange and age to orange-red, borne July-November and into winter under glass. Probably only hardy to -5°C so best grown as a conservatory plant or brought in for the winter. <p><b>Lonicera x purpusii 'Winter Beauty'</b> 2L 7.50 5L £12.50</p>	<p>A strong growing semi-evergreen shrub Ht. 2.5m x S. 2.5m. Very fragrant cream coloured flowers freely produced from December to April. Moist, fertile soil in sun or light shade.</p>

<p><b>Luma apiculata 'Saint Hilary'</b> 2L £7.50</p>	<p>An evergreen shrub to 2m x 2m. Variegated grey-green and cream leaves on deep-maroon coloured shoots, and cinnamon-coloured bark that peels off in patches leaving cream-coloured contrasting areas. White flowers in late summer and autumn followed by black fruits. Grow in a sheltered position in a moist, well-drained soil in sun or partial shade.</p>
<p><b>Luma chequen</b> 2L £7.50</p>	<p>A robust, medium-sized evergreen shrub or small leafy tree of 6m x 5m, native to Chile. Aromatic, bright-green, undulate leaves. Peeling bark on established plants. White flowers in summer and autumn are followed by black berries. Grow in a moist, well-drained soil in sun or partial shade and with shelter from cold, drying winds. Introduced by William Lobb</p>
<p><b>Luzula sylvatica 'Aurea'</b> 1L £5.00</p>	<p>A vigorous evergreen perennial forming a loose clump of narrow, glossy greenish-yellow leaves in winter and spring which shade greener through summer. 0.5 x 1m. Loose clusters of small brown flowers in spring and summer. Plant in a moist well-drained soil in full or partial shade.</p>
<p><b>Luzuriaga radicans</b> 1L £5.00</p>	<p>A creeping evergreen only a few cm high from Argentina and Chile. It will cling to walls or climb trunks of trees. Star-shaped white flowers with conspicuous yellow anthers in summer followed by bright orange berries. Best suited to a mild, sheltered situation (hardy to -5°C). Needs shade (no direct sun), a damp atmosphere and a moist lime-free soil. An interesting plant for conservatory or a fern house.</p>

Highly fragrant, creamy white flowers appear in winter followed by dark red-berried fruit. Any moist well-drained soil in partial to full shade.</p>
<p><b>Mitraria coccinea</b> 2L £10.00</p>	<p>A low growing, spreading evergreen shrub or scandent climber introduced by William Lobb from Chile. With small, glossy, leathery leaves. Bright orange-scarlet tubular flowers from late spring - early autumn. Requires a warm, sheltered position in semi-shade and a moist, lime-free soil.</p>
<p><b>Mitraria coccinea 'Lago Puyehue'</b> 2-3L £10.00</p>	<p>A low-growing, spreading evergreen shrub or scandent climber with small, glossy, leathery leaves. <p><b>Myrteola nummularia</b> 1L £5.00 2L £7.50</p>	<p>A small spreading, prostrate evergreen shrublet. Wiry reddish stems with rounded lustrous green leaves. White flowers in May &amp; June followed by long persisting pink or red berries. From the Andes of Southern Argentina and Chile, the Fuegian Islands and the Falklands.</p>

<b>Philadelphus 'Snowbelle'</b> (P. 'Manteau d'Hermine x P. 'Virginal')	A compact, deciduous shrub with fragrant double bell-shaped white flowers, each with up to 15 petals during the summer. Plant in any fertile, well-drained soil in sun or partial shade.
<b>Philadelphus 'Virginal'</b> 2L £7.50	A strong growing, upright, deciduous shrub to 3m x 2.5m. Very fragrant white, double flowers 2.5 – 3.5cm across during summer. Plant in any fertile, well-drained soil in sun or partial shade.
<b>Philadelphus coronarius 'Aureus'</b> 2L £7.50	An upright, deciduous shrub that will reach 2m x 1.5m. Leaves are bright yellow when young, becoming yellow-green as the season progresses. Corymbs of white flowers in spring are followed by large pendant bunches of crimson berries. Plant in a moist, well drained soil in sun or partial shade. Discovered by Père Armand David and introduced by George Forrest.</p>
<p><b>Photinia davidiana var. Salicifolia</b></p> <p>2L £10.00</p>	<p>An erect evergreen shrub or small tree of 6m x 3m from W. China. Dark-green narrow-oblong or narrow -lanceolate leathery leaves, the oldest turning scarlet in autumn. Corymbs of white flowers in spring are followed by large pendant bunches of crimson berries. Plant in a moist, well drained soil in sun or partial shade. Introduced by Ernest Wilson.</p>
<p><b>Photinia villosa</b></p> <p>3L £10.00</p>	<p>A deciduous large shrub or small tree of 5m x 3m, from Korea, China and Japan. Hawthorn-like corymbs of white flowers in spring are followed by small bright-red fruits. The leaves turn scarlet and gold in the autumn and is one of the most spectacular plants for autumn colour. Grow in ang moist, well-drained soil in sun or partial shade.</p>
<p><b>Phyllocladus aspleniifolius</b></p> <p>2L £15.00</p>	<p>A small coniferous tree native of Tasmania, with glaucous fan-shaped toothed cladodes.A plant for mild or sheltered gardens or the conservatory. Plant in a moist, well drained soil in a sheltered position.</p>
<p><b>Podocarpus salignus</b></p> <p>2-3L £10.00</p>	<p>An evergreen, small to medium upright tree to Ht. 15m. Arching branches, well furnished with sickle-shaped, glossy willow -like leaves. Endemis to Chile. Grow in a moist, well drained soil, sheltered from cold drying winds.</p>
<p><b>Prostanthera cuneata</b></p> <p>2-3L £7.50</p>	<p>A dwarf evergreen shrub (1m x 1m) from SE Australia and Tasmania with small, dark green, aromatic leaves. Loose trusses of funnel-shaped white flowers with yellow markings open from mauve buds in late spring. Will tolerate slightly alkaline soils. Plant in a moist, well drained humus-rich soil in sun or semi-shade. A robust plant, good for shelter.
<b>Rhododendron 'Monarch Horizon'</b> 4L £12.50	A medium-sized hardy evergreen shrub of 2 x 2.5m, with dark-green, leathery leaves. The large pale-yellow flowers with red flares open from red buds and are carried in upright trusses of 15-20 blooms in May-June. Plant in a moist, well-drained, humus-rich acidic soil in dappled shade.
<b>Rhododendron 'Ramapo'</b> 1-2L £5.00	A dwarf, hardy, compact evergreen shrub to 0.5 x 0.5m, with attractive blue-green foliage. Clusters of small pale violet-purple flowers are freely borne in late spring and summer. Best grown in full sun. Plant in a well drained but humus-rich acidic soil.

<b>Rosa davidii</b> 3L £10.00	A strong-growing medium-sized (3.5 x 3.5m) shrub first discovered by Armand David in W. Sichuan, China. Of erect, open habit with large corymbs of rose-pink flowers 5cm across followed by conspicuous bunches of ovoid, scarlet pendent fruits. Plant in any moist, well drained soil in sun or semi-shade.
<b>Rosa elegantula 'Persetosa' (Threepenny Bit Rose)</b> 3L £10.00	A charming deciduous shrub up to 2m with fern-like leaves. The small flowers borne in June are coral-red in bud, opening salmon-pink, and followed by bright coral-red fruits that last well into winter. These contrast well with the crimson and purple of the autumn leaves. Plant in sun or partial shade in any fertile soil.
<b>Rosa forrestiana</b> 3L £10.00	A strong-growing medium-sized shrub with arching stems to 2m from introduced from W. China by George Forrest. Four petalled flowers of creamy white appear in summer followed by red pear shaped hips. A native of west China. Any moist and well drained soil. Sun or partial shade. Introduced by Abbe Delavay.
<b>Rosmarinus officinalis Prostratus Group</b> 2L £10.00	A low-growing evergreen shrub with aromatic foliage, forming a dense, prostrate mat of 0.1 x 1m. Clusters of blue flowers are borne in May and June, and again occasionally in autumn. Grow in full sun, and prefers a poor, well-drained soil.

<p><b>Rubus tricolor</b></p> <p>2L £5.00</p>	<p>An evergreen shrub with long-trailing, red, densely bristly stems. Leaves dark-green above, white-felted beneath. The showy, bell-shaped pendant deep purple flowers with conspicuous green calyces are borne in April – June. Best in a well drained humus-rich soil. A good woodland garden plant. TOXIC IF INGESTED</p>
<p><b>Scopolia carniolica 'Brevifolia'</b></p> <p>2L £7.50</p>	<p>A leaf deciduous perennial to 0.6 x 0.9m. Delightful bell-shaped, pendant yellow flowers with conspicuous green calyces borne April to June. Best in a well drained, humus-rich soil. A good woodland garden plant. TOXIC IF INGESTED</p>
<p><b>Scopolia stramonifolia</b></p> <p>2L £7.50</p>	<p>A course upright perennial to 1.5m from Nepal and adjacent parts of China and India with branched stems and leaves which are white- downy beneath. Flowers pale green-yellow with a hint of purple during summer. Well drained, humus rich soil in semi-shade. TOXIC IF INGESTED</p>

<p><b>Scutellaria altissima</b></p> <p>2L £5.00</p>	<p>A clump-forming perennial from central and south east Europe with fresh-green serrated foliage. Salvia-like blue flowers are borne on erect flower stems to 80cm high throughout the summer and autumn. Grow in any reasonable soil in full sun or partial shade. Will happily self-seed. Toxic if ingested.</p>
<p><b>Sequoia sempervirens 'Cantab'</b></p> <p>2L £10.00</p>	<p>A rare, distinctive form of the Coastal redwood, making a strong-growing tree up to 20m. Branches bear comparatively broad, glaucous-green leaves. Plant in a moist, well-drained soil in sun or partial shade.</p>
<p><b>Sequoia sempervirens 'Prostrata'</b></p> <p>2L £10.00</p>	<p>A rare, unusual dwarf form of the Coastal redwood with spreading branches bearing broad, glaucous-green leaves. Will grow to 1.2m x 3m. Plant in a moist, well-drained soil in sun or partial shade.</p>
<p><b>Sisyrinchium 'Biscuitella'</b></p> <p>P9 £2.50</p>	<p>Small evergreen perennial with grass-like foliage 15-25cm high. Creamy brown flowers in summer. Plant in any reasonable soil in a sunny position.</p>
<p><b>Sisyrinchium 'E K Balls'</b></p> <p>P9 £2.50</p>	<p>Small evergreen perennial with grass-like foliage 15-25cm high. Mauve flowers with a yellow eye . Plant in any reasonable soil in a sunny position.</p>
<p><b>Skimmia japonica 'Marlot'</b></p> <p>2L £7.50</p>	<p>Small, evergreen dome shaped shrub Ht. 0.5m x S. 0.5m. Dense green flower heads produced in autumn which turn deep red before opening as fragrant pink flowers in spring. Shade loving, moist well drained soil. Can be grown in a container. Avoid light soils in full sun.</p>
<p><b>Skimmia x confusa 'Kew Green'</b></p> <p>2L £7.50</p>	<p>A small, mound-forming evergreen shrub of 0.5m x 1m with aromatic, broadly lanceolate dark-green leaves. Large clusters of small, fragrant greenish-yellow flowers in spring. Grow in a moist, well - drained soil in partial of full shade.</p>
<p><b>Solanum laxum 'Album'</b></p> <p>2L - £7.50</p>	<p>A slender, fast growing semi-evergreen climber. Fragrant star-shaped white flowers with yellow centres are freely borne in loose clusters from mid-summer until the autumn frosts. Grow in a sunny position with protection of a wall in a free draining soil, or in a conservatory.</p>
<p><b>Solanum crispum 'Glasnevin'</b></p> <p>3-4L - £10.00</p>	<p>A vigorous semi-evergreen scrambling shrub best trained against a wall or fence. Rich purple-blue flowers with bright yellow stamens are borne in loose clusters through summer and autumn. Grow in full sun in any moist, well-drained soil. Toxic</p>

<p><b>Sophora 'Sun King'</b> (syn. <i>S. microphylla</i> 'Sun King')</p> <p>2L - £10.00</p>	<p>A hardy evergreen hybrid of two Chilean species, <i>S. cassioides</i> &amp; <i>S. macrocarpa</i> of bushy habit to 2 x 2 m. Pinnate leaves of up to 40 pairs of leaflets. Large bright yellow flowers are borne in profusion over a long period during late winter and spring. Grow in any moderately fertile soil in full sun with shelter from cold winds. Can be trained as a wall shrub. Toxic if ingested.</p>

<p><b>Thamnocalamnus crassinodus</b> 'Kew Beauty'</p> <p>4L £15.00</p>	<p>A very attractive bamboo forming a dense, arching clump up to 4 m high. Distinctive blue-grey canes which become red-brown with age with reddish branches. Plant in a moist, well-drained soil in light shade and shelter from cold winds. Suitable for growing in a container.</p>
<p><b>Thuja occidentalis 'Danica'</b></p> <p>2L £7.50</p>	<p>A slow-growing, dwarf conifer to 0.5 x 0.5m, of dense, compact, globular habit with the foliage held in erect, flattened sprays. Glossy bright emerald-green becomes tinted bronze in winter. Grow in a moist, well-drained soil with some shelter from cold winds when young.</p>
<p><b>Thuja occidentalis 'Sunkist'</b></p> <p>2L £7.50</p>	<p>A dense conifer of broadly conical, round-topped habit to 1.2 x 0.9m, with foliage in flattened sprays, golden-yellow in summer turning orange-yellow in winter. Grow in a moist, well-drained soil with some shelter from cold winds when young.</p>
<p><b>Thuja plicata 'Gelderland'</b></p> <p>2L £7.50</p>	<p>A strong-growing upright conifer of compact habit. The mid-green aromatic foliage takes on a bronze tinting in winter. Makes a fine specimen tree. Plant in a moist, well drained soil in a sunny position.</p>

<p><b>Ugni molinae</b></p> <p>2L £5.00 3L £7.50 4L £10.00</p>	<p>An evergreen, small to medium sized shrub (Ht. 2m x S 2m) with glossy leaves. Nodding pink tinged white flowers appear early summer followed by mahogany-red berries. Native of the temperate rain forests of Southern Chile. Grow in full sun or light shade in moist, well drained soil. Shelter from cold winds.</p>
<p><b>Ugni molinae 'Butterball'</b></p> <p>2L £7.50</p>	<p>A slow-growing, small to medium-sized evergreen shrub with leaves variegated with coral-coloured young growth (1.5 x 1m). Flowers are white flushed with pink and are followed by edible mahogany-red berries in the autumn. Grow in a moist, well-drained soil sun or partial shade and with shelter from cold winds. Works well as a container specimen.</p>
<p><b>Ugni molinae 'Flambeau'</b></p> <p>2L £7.50</p>	<p>A slow-growing, small to medium-sized evergreen shrub with leaves variegated with cream, green and pink (1.5 x 1m). Flowers are white flushed with pink and are followed by edible mahogany-red berries in the autumn. Grow in a moist, well-drained soil sun or partial shade and with shelter from cold winds.</p>

<p><b>Vancouveria chrysatha</b></p> <p>2L £10.00</p>	<p>A creeping evergreen perennial related to <i>Epimediums</i> from Western U.S.A. Wiry brown stems carry 3-lobed dark green leaves, tinted dark bronze towards the edge. Delicate rich-yellow flowers hover above on wiry stems up to 30cm through May and June. Moist, well drained soil in part shade. Good woodland plant.</p>
<p><b>Veronicastrum virginicum 'Erica'</b></p> <p>2L £10.00</p>	<p>A tall, bushy, clump-forming perennial of 1.2m x 0.75m. Dark green leaves and large spikes of red buds that open to soft pink flowers from mid-summer in to autumn. Loved by butterflies and good for cutting. Plant in full sun in any moist, well-drained soil.</p>
<p><b>Vestia foetida</b></p> <p>2L £7.50 4L £12.50</p>	<p>A small, erect, evergreen shrub of 2m x 1.5m, endemic to Chile. Foliage foetid when crushed. Nodding, tubular, pale yellow flowers borne in profusion from April to July followed by small yellow fruits. Grow in a warm, sunny position with shelter from cold, drying winds, in a well drained soil.</p>

<p><b>Viburnum x burkwoodii 'Anne Russell'</b></p> <p>2L - £12.50</p>	<p>Grown on own roots so no suckering rootstock. A compact, semi-evergreen shrub slowly attaining 1.5m x 1.5 m. Rounded clusters of wonderfully fragrant flowers, pink in bud opening to white, are produced from January to May. Plant in a moist, well-drained soil in sun or shade.</p>
<p><b>Viburnum cylindricum</b></p> <p>5L - £15.00</p>	<p>A superb, large evergreen shrub from East Asia Ht. 5m x S. 5m. Hardy to -10 degrees c. Large finely toothed matt green leaves with a waxy upper surface. Small white flowers appear from July through to September. Requires a sheltered site with moist, well drained soil. Full sun to light shade.</p>
<p><b>Viburnum henryi</b></p> <p>2L - £12.50</p>	<p>An evergreen shrub of open, erect habit, 2.5m x 2.5m from central China. Stiff branches carry glossy dark green leaves. New leaves are bronze-tinted. Panicles of fragrant white flowers in summer, are followed by fruits that start red and become black. Moist, well- drained lime-free soil in sun or semi-shade.</p>
<p><b>Viburnum opulus 'Compactum'</b></p> <p>2L - £5.00</p>	<p>A small, deciduous shrub of dense, compact habit, to 1m x1m. Flattened heads of small white fertile flowers surrounded by creamy- white sterile ones are freely borne in summer, followed by bright-red berries. The leaves turn purplish-pink in autumn before falling. Grow in any moist, well-drained soil.</p>
<p><b>Viburnum plicatum f.tomentosum 'Kilimanjaro'</b></p> <p>2L - £7.50</p>	<p>A deciduous shrub (3m x 1.5m) with tiered branches but forming a more upright, pyramidal form than other selections, so good for more confined spaces. Flat sprays of small, fertile creamy-white flowers surrounded by conspicuous white ray flowers in late spring. Fruits start red and age to black. Leaves take on good tints in autumn before falling. Grow in a moist, well-drained soil in sun or partial shade.</p>
<p><b>Viburnum plicatum f.tomentosum 'Lanarth'</b></p> <p>2L - £7.50</p>	<p>A wide-spreading deciduous shrub (3m x 3m) with branches produced in layers creating a tiered effect. Flat sprays of small, fertile creamy-white flowers surrounded by conspicuous white ray flowers in late spring. Fruits start red and age to black. More upright in growth than 'Mariesii'. Good for autumn colour. Grow in a moist, well-drained soil in sun or partial shade.</p>
<p><b>Viburnum plicatum f.tomentosum 'Mariesii'</b></p> <p>2L - £7.50</p>	<p>A wide-spreading deciduous shrub (3m x 3m) with branches produced in layers creating a tiered effect. Flat sprays of small, fertile creamy-white flowers surrounded by conspicuous white ray flowers in late spring. The flowers are larger than in 'Lanarth'. Fruits start red and age to black. Good for autumn colour. Grow in a moist, well-drained soil in sun or partial shade.</p>
<p><b>Viburnum plicatum f.tomentosum 'Pink Beauty'</b></p> <p>2L - £7.50</p>	<p>A wide-spreading deciduous shrub (3m x 3m) with branches produced in layers creating a tiered effect. Flat sprays of small, fertile creamy-white flowers surrounded by conspicuous pink ray flowers in late spring. Fruits start red and age to black. Very free-fruiting. Leaves take on reddish tints before falling. Grow in a moist, well- drained soil in sun or partial shade.</p>
<p><b>Viburnum rhytidophyllum</b></p> <p>2L - £7.50</p>	<p>A large, fast-growing evergreen shrub from C. and W. China introduced by E. H. Wilson. Large, corrugated leaves are dark, glossy green above and densely grey-tomentose beneath. Domed heads of creamy-white flowers in May followed by ovoid red fruits which ripen to black. Grow in a fertile, well-drained soil in sun or semi- shade.</p>
<p><b>Viburnum sargentii 'Onondaga'</b></p> <p>2L - £7.50</p>	<p>A large, vigorous shrub of 2.5m x 2m with maple-like leaves which are deep maroon when young and become reddish-purple in the autumn. The lace-cap flowers in late spring comprise fertile flowers deep red in bud opening rose-pink surrounded by a ring of white sterile florets. Plant in any moist, well-drained soil in sun or partial shade.</p>
<p><b>Viburnum tinus 'French White'</b></p> <p>2L - £7.50</p>	<p>Strong growing, hardy evergreen shrub to 3m x 3m, with larger leaves than other cultivars. Flattened heads of white flowers open from rosy- red buds from December to April, followed by dark blue-black fruits. Grow in a moist, well-drained soil in full sun or semi-shade, although is tolerant of deeper shade.</p>

<p><b>Weigela middendorffiana</b></p> <p>2-3L - £10.00</p>	<p>A small deciduous shrub (1.5 m x 1.5m) with broadly ovate, abruptly pointed leaves, from Japan and N China. Bell-shaped flowers borne in April to June are sulphur-yellow with dark orange markings. Grow in a moist, well-drained soil in sun or partial shade and with some shelter from cold winds.</p>
<p><b>Weigela 'Rosabella'</b></p> <p>2-3L - £10.00</p>	<p>A delightful deciduous shrub of 1.5 mx 1.5m, first introduced in 1958 but little grown. Clusters of bell-shaped flowers borne in late spring and summer. Red buds open to pale-pink flowers which fade to deep pink. Grow in a moist, well drained soil in sun or partial shade.</p>
